What is RUN-EU?

RUN-EU is an alliance of European universities that offers unique internationalization opportunities for students, teachers, researchers, technical staff, and administrative staff through joint study programs, experience exchanges, and joint initiatives in the field of research, development, and innovation (R&D&I) in the context of international mobility and activities supporting interregional development in various European countries.

RUN-EU aims to build a truly European university with the goal of strengthening connections between people through the sharing of skills and experiences.

The more we connect, share, collaborate, and learn from each other, the greater the potential we can create together for the future.

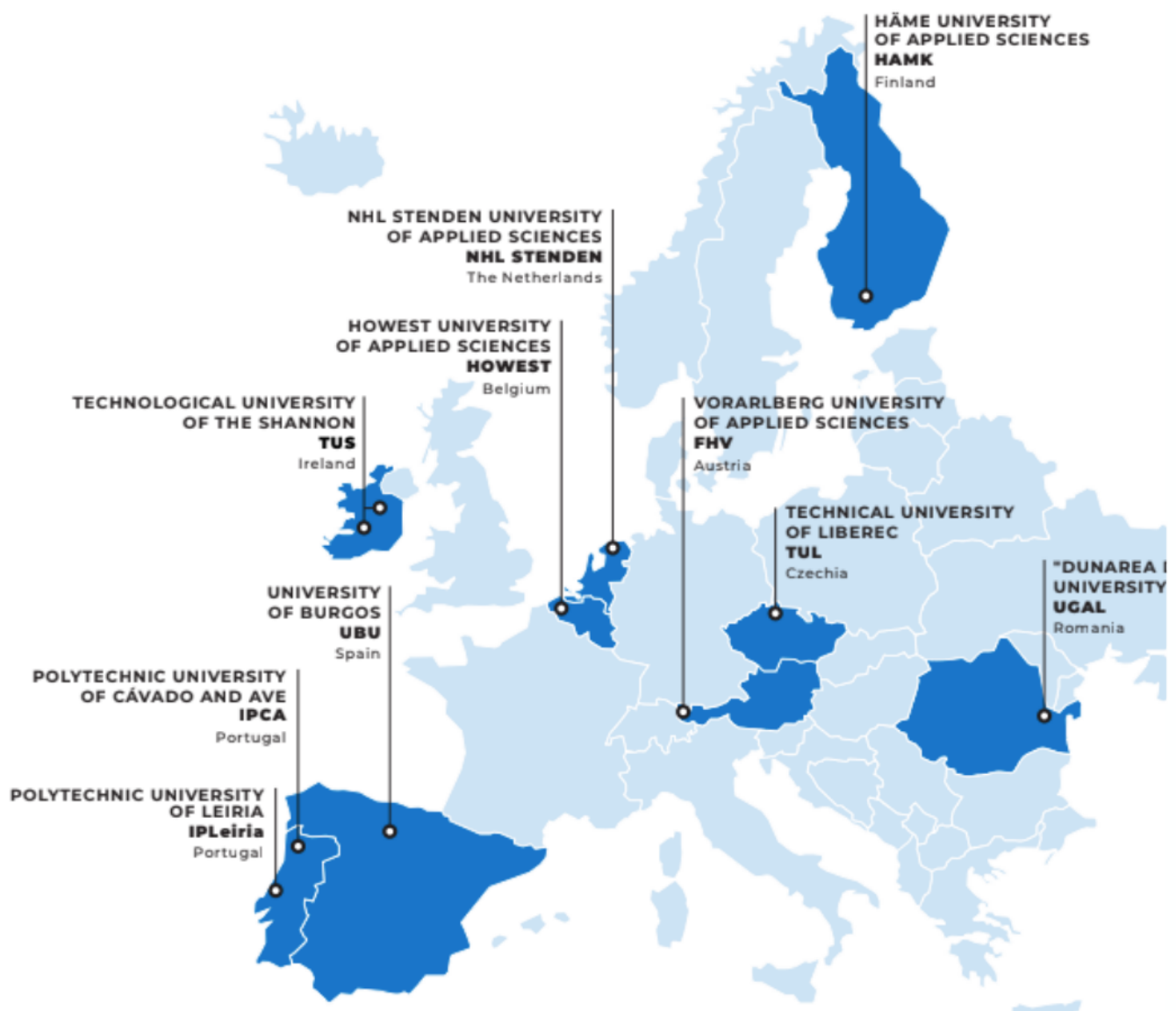

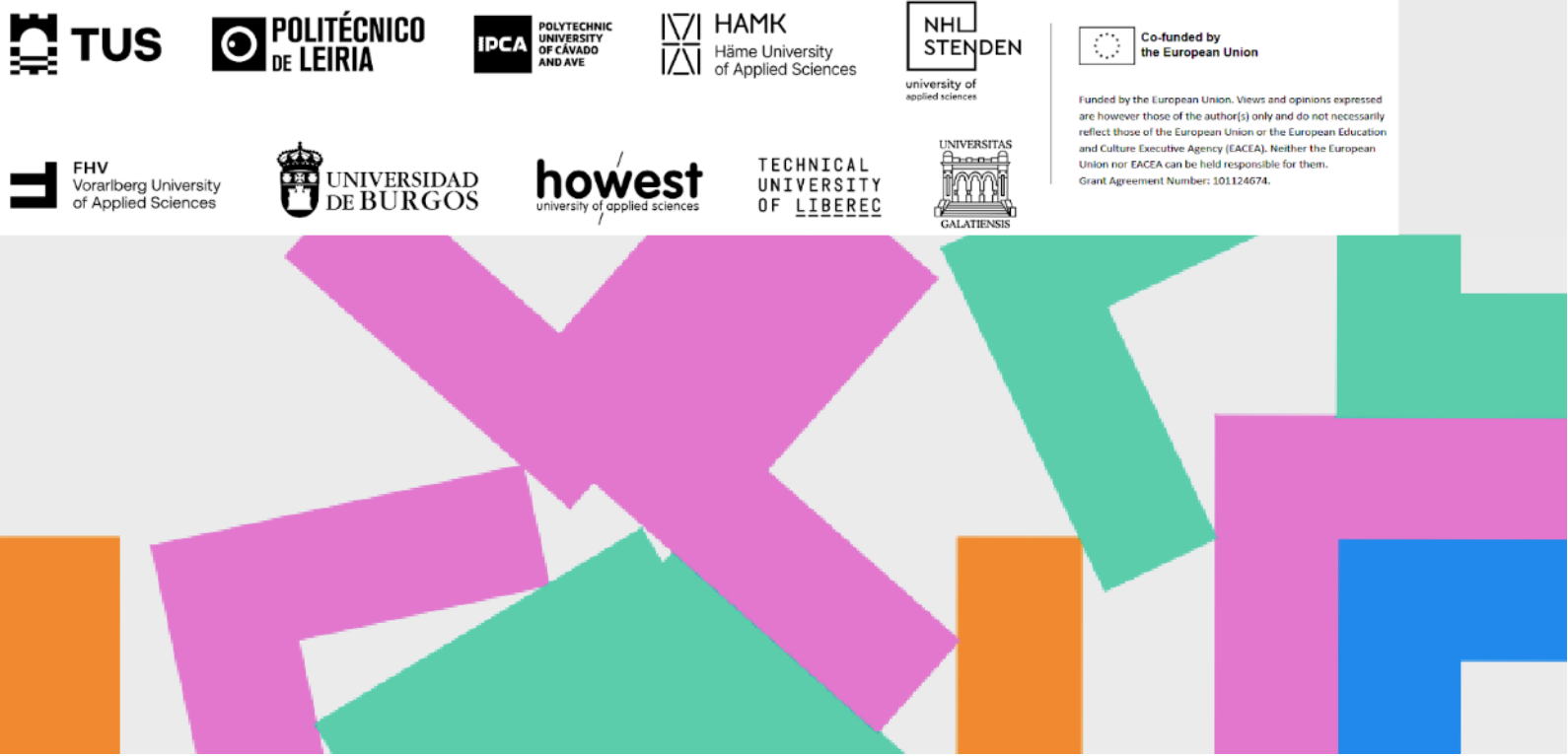

Student Council

The Student Council is a body composed of student representatives that operates within the RUN-EU (Regional University Network - European University) alliance.

Its aim is to represent and promote the interests of students across universities involved in RUN-EU, support their mobility, organize joint events, and facilitate the sharing of experiences between students from different countries and cultural backgrounds.

This involves the participation of approximately 10–15 students, who will have the opportunity to meet 1–2 times a year for a week-long meeting abroad.

From this group, approximately 5 students will be selected to promote RUN-EU in various ways, such as recording podcasts, preparing content for social media, or giving presentations at faculties.

What working groups do we have in the alliance?

WP1 - Coordination and Management

This work package, led by TUS, ensures the smooth implementation of the RUN-EU 2.0 project through professional project management, effective communication, and thorough monitoring and evaluation. It will create the necessary structures and processes for the successful completion of all project activities and outputs.

WP2 - RUN-EPA - European Programmes Academy

This work package, led by HAMK, aims to strengthen the educational mission of RUN-EU by creating new joint learning opportunities focused on future and advanced skills. It promotes pedagogical innovation and the development of various types of programs, including short advanced programs (SAP), blended intensive programs (BIP), international online collaboration in teaching (COIL), massive open online courses (MOOC), and European diplomas.

WP3 - RUN-ERA - RUN-European Research Area

This work package, led by TUS, aims to strengthen the research and innovation capacity of RUN-EU by supporting joint research opportunities and involving external stakeholders. It will establish RUN-European Research Area (RUN-ERA) and support the development of a research community across the entire alliance.

WP4 - RUN-ESEC - RUN-European Stakeholder Engagement Centre

This work package, led by UBU, focuses on establishing a European Stakeholder Engagement Center (ESEC) to promote the systematic involvement of external stakeholders from business, industry, society, and regional administration. It aims to support entrepreneurial education, innovation labs, and initiatives focused on services to society.

WP5 - RUN-EMIC - Run European Mobility and Innovation Centre

This work package, led by NHL Stenden, aims to expand support and services for mobility opportunities within RUN-EU and raise awareness of EU values and priorities. It will focus on promoting various forms of mobility, including physical, virtual, and blended, and strengthening the culture of European values.

WP6 - RUN-EU Governance, Legal status, Systems and Sustainability

This work package, led by IPLeiria, aims to create a European University with legal personality, the power to award its own degrees, and shared governance, administrative structure, and systems. It will focus on developing strategies for the legal framework, joint study programs, shared systems, and the long-term sustainability of the RUN-EU alliance.

WP7 - Communication, Dissemination and Impact

Led by IPLeiria. This WP is responsible for internal and external communication, dissemination of project results, and measurement of the alliance's impact. A central communication and dissemination office will be set up to ensure the visibility and value of RUN-EU.
